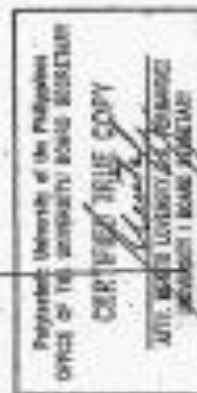

II. Highlights of the Meeting

1. According to EVP Manintim Book 1 will focus on the foundation of the PUP system and Book 2 will focus on the operational system, manual of operations, procedures, and policies of the University. She likewise stated that there are some parts in the existing University code that are more appropriate to be placed in the appendices.

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2. HEA Gapesin mentioned that the University code has been through three administrations of Executive Vice Presidents. First was during Dr. Naval's time and second during Dr. Muhi's time as EVP. Eventually, it will be finished in the term of EVP Manimtim. Furthermore, HEA Gapesin inquired on the recent copy of the University Code.
3. EVP Manimtim stated that the body will look at the two existing versions of the University Code. She added that during the coordination meeting with Atty. Liao, AVPAA Mariano and O EVP FA Abayan-Perez, the drafting of Book 1 outline and scope were guided by the legal basis, overall functions and aspects of the University system. The group agreed that Book 1 should contain provisions that shall not be affected by realignment of units, changes in the organizational chart, and operational guidelines revisions.
4. HEA Gapesin inquired on the reason why the Obelisk, Mural, and the Transformation were removed on Article 1 Section 4 of the University Code. EVP Manimtim answered that the real and unique symbol of PUP is the Pylon. The rest are just additional symbols.
5. EVP Manimtim mentioned that the institutional history and the goals of higher education which were drawn from CHED thrusts can be placed at the appendices of the University code.
6. HEA Gapesin asked about the Ex Officio Treasurer position on Article 3 Section 4 of the University Code. The body decided to check its basis.
7. HEA Gapesin queried why Article 5 and the rest of the articles did not begin with the structure of the particular office. EVP Manimtim answered that it was done on purpose to avoid being affected by changes in the organizational chart/structure. Narratives regarding the functions of the offices which are more flexible shall be included. AVPAA Mariano added that it is better to have general statements because it has been a practice in the University that when there is a new president there are also new alignment of offices/units.
8. HEA Gapesin asked where the Office of Branches and Campuses and the Office of International Affairs will be included. EVP Manimtim answered that they can be included on Article 4. She likewise said that the creation of a Presidential Sector, if necessary, shall be considered.
9. AVPAA Mariano cited that the focus is not the offices but the services that the offices offer. With that, EVP Manimtim asked the body if the term "Sectoral Offices" might be considered. She also stated that the title of

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Article 13 is still tentative. The body decided to rename Article 13 as Sectoral and Support Offices. Its sections are the following:

- I. Academic Services
- II. Administrative Services
- III. Research Services
- IV. Finance Services

10. AVPAA Mariano suggested not to divide the articles into sections anymore but to alphabetize the list of offices.

11. AVPSAS Latoza asked if the University Code will be presented to the Execom. He expressed his apprehension on the idea that the parts being considered by the body might be disapproved by the Execom. Further, AVPSAS Latoza inquired if the position of Associate Dean should still appear in the University Code. EVP Manimim answered that the word "maybe" was used on that part because a college may or may not have an Associate Dean. HEA Gapasin suggested that in the IRR, the body can just explain the reasons for adding an associate dean. It is based on the number of the students and how big the college is.

12. HEA Gapasin suggested that the members of the Execom be given copies of the University Code prior to the next Execom meeting so that the members can prepare their comments and suggestions beforehand.

13. EVP Manimim ended with this summary:

- I. The outline will be presented first to the Execom for their comments.
- II. The body will ask Atty. Liso regarding the basis of the Ex. Officio Treasurer on Article 3 Section 4 of the University Code.
- III. The body decided to rename Article 13 as Sectoral and Support Offices.
- IV. The Committee will meet again once the outline has been presented to the members of the Execom.

The meeting started with a prayer and the singing of the national anthem. Chair Manimtim explained the rationale of the consultation with the faculty, administrative staff and students. She likewise explained the history of the revision of the University Code. She mentioned that this is part of the participativeness culture that the administration wants to be embedded in the processes within the University. She further explained that the Board of Regents wanted a wider participation/dissemination of the Proposed Revised version of the Code. Moreover, she stated that the revised Code was drafted

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in such a way that the "services" instead of the offices and the sectors where they belong is the focus. is the focus to make the Code "enduring" and not be made obsolete with structural changes and realignments.

Director Jose Abat of the Office of the Student Services welcomed the student leaders for attending the consultative meeting. He then called EVP Herminia Manimtim to preside over the meeting.

EVP Manimtim explained the reason for the consultative meeting and emphasized the importance of updating the University Code as it is like the Constitution of the Philippines. As Chair of the Committee that revised the PUP Student Handbook in 2014, she noted that the Code itself has not undergone any revision at all. Accordingly, the last time it was revised was in 1978. Therefore, the very reason for the current revision is to keep attuned with the changes that have occurred for the last so many years. Though there were initiatives undertaken by her predecessors to revise the Code but it was only on March, 2017 regular meeting of the PUP Board of Regents that a final revised version was presented for approval. The Board deferred its approval until a consultation with the faculty and students sectors is held.

Through a powerpoint presentation, EVP Manimtim went on to present the proposed changes in the University Code section by section. She encouraged the student leaders to freely express their opinions, comments, and suggestions.

As to the PUP Logo under Section 5 under Article 1, Ms. Clarissa Mendoza, President CPSPA Student Council commented that while the color of the star as stated in the Code is golden yellow and the Student Handbook says it is also golden yellow yet Section 5 under the same Article, The PUP Colors and Seal, it says the University colors shall gold and maroon.



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

During the discussion of Section 3 – Powers and Duties of the Board of Regents, Student Council President Elijah San Fernando clarified that ANAK – or the Alyansa ng Nagkakaisang Konseho, not the Central Student Council, is the one which shall call for the election of the Student Regent. While the Student Council Assembly (SCA) is composed of the PUP Main college council presidents and Central Student President, Vice President and 2 councilors, ANAK is composed of the SCA and the presidents of the student councils of PUP branches and campuses. If there is no student representative in the BOR, then it is incumbent upon ANAK-Execom to call an election for such purpose.



COMMENTS OF THE BOR-TWG MEMBERS FOR THE COLLEGE DEVELOPMENT PLANS FROM

1. Hon. Margarita R. Sangoa- Deputy Director General, National Economic and Development Authority

COLLEGE OF ARCHITECTURE AND FINE ARTS

General Comments:

- a. There should be clear ownership and acceptance by all stakeholders in the University Vision, Mission and Goals. Many of the colleges still refer to these as the President's of the PUP.
- b. The plans should be stated in simple terms that can easily be understood by all stakeholders.
- c. Some of the indicators do not have base years/ base levels such that it is difficult to assess how much more needs to be done to achieve the targets.
- d. The bases for the budget estimates are not clear. Are the amounts presented "wishes" or can the university provide for such estimates, whether through appropriations from the university budget or from the revenue raising initiatives of the individual colleges?
- e. For plans to be effective, implementable and serve their purpose, there is need for the synchronization of planning and budgeting. It is useless to plan if there are no resources to support their realization.
- f. There appears to be no clear understanding as to what a "strategy" is vis-a-vis "PAPs"
- g. Some of the colleges stated so many activities to be undertaken which raises the question as to the implementability of all these proposed actions, given the availability of resources. It might be argued that a number of the proposed interventions are already on-going. Then, there should be a distinction between those which are existing and new ones to serve as basis in evaluating the impact of the different actions in meeting the goals of the college.
- h. Many, if not all the academic units aimed to be "comparable with other schools nationally and worldwide". This is vague. There are so many schools in the Philippines and around the world. What is the benchmark?
- i. As regards, goal 2, i.e., embedding a culture of research, the proposed actions are geared towards the dissemination and packaging of research outputs already with minimal efforts towards the production of the research work.
- j. While the college development plans are for the period 2014-2016, in many instances there is no indication as to when the targets are expected to be achieved, i.e., in 2015 or all the targets are to be realized only by 2016.
- k. Formulation of college development plans should not be viewed as merely for compliance but that these should be realistic, implementable with the necessary resources to obtain the desired goals and vision.

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


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Specific Comments

 - c. Agenda 2, it does not show how the unit will go about encouraging the production of research outputs but concentrates on research presentations/ publications etc.
 - d. Agenda 3, objective 1, performance indicators, attainment of these is subject to the availability of the plantilla positions and compliance with qualification standards.
 - e. Agenda 4, objective 3, performance indicator, what are the chances of an allocation of Php. 900,000.00 per annum being granted? Note that the CAFA is only one of the many ~~academic~~ units of the University for Limited Resources.
 - f. Agenda 7, the content of the objective, KRA, performance indicators, strategies to the goal of fiscal responsibility is not clear. Is this in line with revenue generation initiatives of the college? Is it prudent utilization of the 45,000.00 budget being requested?
 - g. Agenda 8, are the objectives, KRAs, Strategies, performance indicators taking off from an evaluation of the current situation?
 - h. There are just so many objectives. What would be the priorities?



President Emanuel C. De Guzman stated that the approved new and revised academic programs would be submitted to the Board of Regents and CHED for approval.

V. OTHER ACADEMIC MATTERS

1. Dr. Adela Cristeta J. Ruiz informed the body that the program Bachelor of Arts in English had been evaluated for Level 4 accreditation and was scheduled to survey revisit of the accreditors. She queried from the body if the University will no longer pursue the scheduled revisit of accreditors since the program of Bachelor of Arts in English had been changed to Bachelor of Arts in English Language Studies and Bachelor of Arts in Literary and Cultural Studies which are entirely different from Bachelor of Arts in English. She added that in other case in which the program was just renamed, it can be requested that the accreditation status of the program be carried over to the new program.

President Emanuel De Guzman answered that the University would formally write the concerned accreditor to request the accreditation status of the replaced program be carried over to the new programs.

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



VPAA Miamel M. Muhi informed the body that there was no curricular revision.

V. OTHER ACADEMIC MATTERS

I. Revocation of Degrees Granted to Six (6) Students

VP Herminda E. Manimtim informed the body that upon thorough evaluation and investigation on the case of alteration of grades in the SIS accounts of 105 students, the

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Legal Counsel Office and the Student Records Monitoring and Audit Committee found out that there are six (6) students who have been granted the degrees but were later found out to have caused the falsification or erroneous posting of their grades. The Student Records Monitoring and Audit Committee recommended the revocation of the degrees granted to six (6) students.

VP Manimtim further explained that out of the 105 people in the list, 31 students have been cleared and 48 have been meted with sanctions including the six (6) students who have already been granted degrees. However, it is stated in their Certificates of Candidacy that once there is erroneous recording of grade or discrepancy, it is a reason for the cancellation of degree.

President De Guzman added that the penalties ranged from suspension of weeks, months, and some are dismissed from the school. That the case was brought to the Board of Regents and to NBI for possible filing of criminal charges to those involved including the principal who is a former faculty of PUP. The revocation of the individual degree will be published in the newspaper as required by the law.

On the query of security of the faculty members, President De Guzman said that the university upgrades the system and has regular checking and monitoring of it.

After some discussion, EVP/VPSAS Manimtim moved for the approval of the revocation of degrees granted to six (6) students who found to have caused the falsification of their grades in the Student Information System.

The motion was duly seconded, and approved.

2. Subject Statistical Inference with SPSS with Code STAT 2303

Director Elmer G. De Jose informed the body that during evaluation of student records, he noticed the course title of one subject under Bachelor of Secondary Education major in Mathematics was written Statistical Inference with SPSS. He expressed his concern about the inclusion of the phrase with SPSS in the said subject because he knew that SPSS is a license software. The San Pedro Campus has been offering the said subject since 2011 but there was no Laboratory for SPSS.

VPRED Joseph Mercado answered that PUP has existing SPSS license version 13, and the university would purchase 40 units of computers with SPSS license.

Dir. De Jose emphasized that whether the SPSS is used by professor or not, the word SPSS is written in the documents. He suggested the change of course title and strike out the words "with SPSS".

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VPRED Joseph Mercado commented that the implementation of deletion of the word "with SPSS" cannot be retroactive since there were students who are already graduated. Besides the University would purchase SPSS license.

VPA Alberto C. Gallo suggested to look at the rationale for adding the phrase with SPSS in the course title Statistical Inference and to adopt more generic phrases, like "with computer application".

At this point, Director Elmer de Jose moved for the renaming of the course title Statistical Inference with SPSS to Statistical Inference with Software Applications.

VPRED Mercado suggested that the changes should pass the University Curriculum Evaluation Committee first for further evaluation and recommendation for the approval of the Academic Council.

On the suggestion of VPRED Mercado, President De Guzman tasked VPAA Muhi to handle the revision of the course title Statistical Inference with Statistical Software Applications following the procedure.

President de Guzman informed Dr. Adela Cristina J. Ruiz that he would be creating a section under Quality Assurance Center to take care of the curriculum revision and planning.

3. Salary Adjustment

Chairperson Marvin Lai inquired about the status of the request from DBM regarding the salary increment of teachers. Pres. De Guzman answered that the request is still pending at the DBM. The university is working on convincing the DBM to release the counterpart fund to pay for the adjustment of part time rate of regular faculty members, but for the adjustment of part time rate of part time faculty, the university has no capability to pay the increase because there was no release from DBM.



C.2. New Curricular Programs

Dean Guillermo O. Bernabe presented to the body the revised Master of Science in Construction Management curriculum and the new programs: Master of Science in Engineering and Doctor of Philosophy in Engineering Management. The three (3) programs were approved by the Open University Curriculum Evaluation Committee on February 17, 2016 and by the University Curriculum Evaluation Committee on February 19, 2016.

Master of Science in Construction Management (MSCM)

The revised MSCM curriculum is designed to provide students with the knowledge and skills in the managerial, technological, economic and environmental aspects of construction. The program is also designed to provide depth through a system approach encompassing project management, estimating, scheduling and project controls, land acquisition and development, architectural and engineering design, construction technology, real estate, finance, business management and marketing. The admission qualifications: must be an appropriate bachelor's degree.



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either in engineering or architecture from universities and colleges of recognized standing, must have an average grade of 2.0, B or 85% in the baccalaureate program, passed an interview with the Academic Program Chair, must submit a two-page topic proposal, demonstrate English proficiency and possess computer literacy. The MScM, a thesis program has a total of 42 credit units with 12 units core courses, 24 units major courses, and 6 units Thesis.

Master of Science in Engineering Management (MSEM)

The Master of Science in Engineering Management program is a graduate professional degree that provides a broad based knowledge and skills to the students to become successful organizational managers with competence in both technical and business acumen. The program is also offered to the students to develop an understanding and skills critical to the support of fast-to-market strategies, systematic analytical framework for managing the engineering and technical functions within manufacturing-based companies. The MSEM curriculum provides engineers with business and management perspective as well as problem solving skills. The curriculum is designed to develop professional engineers ready to address today's complex business problems with innovative solutions and implementing strategies to successfully compete in the 21st century and to help enhance the capabilities to manage major projects, business initiatives, policies and other activities in both public and private sectors. The program was benchmarked to PUP Master of Science in Industrial Engineering and Management, University of Sto. Tomas' Master of Science in Engineering Management, and some universities in United States of America. The MSEM has a total of 42 credit units with 12 units core courses, 18 units major courses, 6 units elective, and 6 units thesis. This is a thesis program. The admission qualifications are same with Master of Science in Construction Management.

Doctor of Philosophy in Engineering Management

The Doctor of Philosophy in Engineering Management program focuses on developing skills needed to conduct rigorous research in areas related to the improvement, design and management of projects and program within complex human-technological systems. These systems include engineering systems, healthcare systems, service systems, and logistical/transportation systems. The proposed program was benchmarked with the same program of the University of United States of America, Europe and in some Universities in Asia such as National University of Science and Technology. The PhD Engineering has a total of 60 credit units with 12 units core courses, 24 units major courses, 6 units electives, 6 units cognates and 12 units dissertation writing. To be admitted in the program the applicants must be holder of master's degree of any engineering and management program from

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universities and colleges of recognized standing, passed an interview with the Academic Program Chair, submit a two-page topic proposal, have 5 years of relevant work experience, computer literate and English proficient.

Dean Theresito Atienza queried on the possibility of offering the proposed programs in the Open University. According to Dr. Atienza, only those programs offered in the Graduate School can be offered in the Open University.

Executive Director Anna Ruby Gasasin clarified that the Commission on Higher Education was consulted on the offering of the proposed programs for MSEM and Ph.D in Engineering Management. A strong engineering program in the undergraduate level is needed before we can offer advanced study programs.

On the proposed Master of Science in Engineering Management, Dr. Adela Cristeta J. Ruiz said that while it is true that all engineering programs are all Level 3 re-accredited, master programs can only be offered in the traditional mode or in Graduate School and not in the Open University. It is the same with offering Ph.D in Engineering Management. Dr. Ruiz added that the programs must first attained excellence in the traditional mode before it can be exported in the open and distance mode.

On the other hand, Dean Carmencita Castaño explained that in the case of Open University, all programs in the traditional mode can be offered in open and distance mode regardless of accreditation status because all programs at that time are exempted from level 3 accreditation. In case of MSCM, it was offered in the Open University although it is not offered in the Graduate School because there was a MOA between PUP and the private sector. She added that the CHED Open and Distance Education Technical Panel has its own accreditation system. Upon the approval of two (2) new programs, these will be applied to CHED through the Office of the Policies and Standards under Dr. Amelis Biglete.

President De Guzman added that we have the expertise and capabilities to offer such programs in the open mode of delivering education. We will proceed keeping in mind the rules and regulations that are being issued by the monitoring agencies of the Polytechnic University of the Philippines which are the Commission on Higher Education, the Civil Service Commission, the Department of Budget and Management and primarily the Board of Regents.

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At this point, Exec. Dir. Anna Ruby Capasin moved for the approval of the revised Master of Science in Construction Management curriculum.

The motion, duly seconded, was approved.

Further, Exec. Dir. Anna Ruby Capasin moved for the approval of the offering of Master of Science in Engineering Management and Doctor of Philosophy in Engineering Management under the Institute of Open and Distance Education of the Open University System subject to our application to the Commission on Higher Education.

There being no objection, the motion, duly seconded, was approved.

Master in Information Technology

Chairperson Benilda Eleonor V. Comendador presented to the body the revision of Master of Science in Information Technology to Master in Information Technology and the repositioning of subjects. The revised Master in Information Technology is built upon depth and guided research with emphasis on publication of research and development outputs. Areas of specialization must be based on current trends in IT. This program aims to develop among its students the knowledge of information technology concepts, techniques and principles of organizations and society. That after completing the MIT Program, the alumni shall create, evaluate and administer the computer-based system that are globally competitive in terms of quality and price, apply advance technical knowledge and skills in evaluating the existing technology and in creating new software applications and design marketable IT products from basic research output. The MIT has 42 units, with 15 units foundation/core subjects, 18 units major courses, 10 courses of choices, 3 units cognates and 6 units thesis. The revised MIT program was approved by the UCEC and benchmark CHED Memo.

Dean Carmencita Castola moved for the approval of the revised Master in Information Technology curriculum.

The motion, duly seconded, was approved.

D. Updates on the Board of Regents Actions regarding Grade Discrepancies and Alteration Issue.

VP Hermenia E. Manimtim informed the body that the Board of Regents acted on the recommendations submitted by the Student Records Monitoring and Audit Committee regarding the illegal changing of grades, grade discrepancies and alterations in the SIS. Right after the discovery of the said issue, sometime in June 2015, the committee was created to investigate and gather information. After several

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meetings with concerned faculty members and students, the committee came up with the following recommendations which approved by the Board of Regents. The first is a set of corrective actions, the revocation of the degree granted to those who shall be found out with illegally altered grades based on existing records but have been granted the degree, the restoration of the altered grades based on records and those who do not have records to show but were altered later. Those students in the list but failed to provide explanation as to their knowledge or non-involvement in the issue shall be made to get clearance from the Legal Office. The second one is the Administrative Sanction which shall be meted depending on the degree of involvement or violation as provided by existing rules and regulations in the Student Handbook and other pertinent policies, rules and regulations. Third set, is the authorization given to the President and Legal Office of PUP by the Board of Regents to file criminal charges against the respondent.

VP Manimtim sought the approval of the body particularly on the revocation of the granted degree to those who have graduated but found out that their grades were illegally changed or altered. President De Guzman added that the due process had been started from the approval of the Board of Regents for filing charges against those individuals who are implicated, administrative employees, faculty members and students alike. The investigation and gathering of evidence had been started from the discovery of the issue, and then sought the authority of the Board of Regents for filing charges.

After some clarifications, Dir. Anastacio C. Gabriel commented that the due process should be observed.

Director Marlon Lim informed the body that immediately after the SIS got hacked they took control of the system and implemented additional safety measures in the SIS.

C. New Curricular Program/ Curricular Revisions

1. New Curricular Program

a) Master of Arts in Communication Management

VP Milagrina A. Gomez informed the body that the new curricular program and curricular revisions passed the screening of the Department, College and the University Curriculum Evaluation Committee. She recommended to the body the approval of the new curricular program and curricular revisions for implementation this coming SY 2016-2017.

Chairperson Anna Ruby Gapsin informed the body that it is time to revise the old curriculum Master in Communication which was offered in the Graduate School and Open University System. The revision was made to comply with the Commission on Higher Education CMO No. 27 of 2011. The suggestion of the University Curriculum Evaluation Committee was to merge the subjects offered both in the Graduate School and Open University. The Master of Arts in Communication Management program will be presented to the Commission on Higher Education after the University Academic Council and Board of Regents' approval. That in the CHED Memo, the total number of units is 36, while in the existing Master in Communication program, the total number of units is 42. The proposed Master of Arts in Communication Management retained 42 units. Dr. Gapsin added that for the traditional mode, it was agreed that the four core courses will be offered both in the Graduate School and Open University.

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VP Joseph Mercado clarified that the Open University and Graduate School should have arrangement that the major subjects taken from Graduate School would be credited to Open University in case the student transfer to Open University, same as Open University to Graduate School.

VPAA Gomez recommends to delete capstone in special project because it would invite a non-thesis program and that simply thesis must be written in the curriculum.

President De Guzman said that it was the agreement that all graduate programs must have thesis.

At this point, VP Mercado moved for the approval of the proposed Master of Arts in Communication Management curriculum, subject to the revision based on the suggestions of the body.

The motion, duly seconded, was approved.

2. Curricular Revisions

- a) Bachelor of Science in Interior Design
- b) Bachelor of Science in Electronics and Communications Engineering
- c) Bachelor of Science in Electrical Engineering

• Bachelor of Science in Interior Design

Chairperson Jocelyn R. Lutap moved for the approval of the revised curriculum of Bachelor of Science in Interior Design. The revision made in the BSID curriculum was the repositioning of subjects and additional number of hours to comply with CMO 28, series of 2008. The revision should be done in 2010 to support the students who will take the board examination but it was not implemented.

Dr. Adela J. Ruiz clarified that the increase in the number of hours would also increase the cost which needs the approval of the body.

VPAA Milagrina Gomez explained that the revision made in 2010 was the deletion of subject Humanities, because it is not part of the CMO 2008 and to give way to the board subject which is important in passing the licensure examination.



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Dean Josefina Parentela added that during University Curriculum Evaluation Committee meeting it was agreed that there would be no additional units and additional hours.

Chairperson Laptop clarified that there was no increase in the number of hours or number of units but only Philippine Ancient History replacing Humanities was not implemented. She added that there would be accreditation of program next year and it might not be considered because the program did not comply with the CMO.

President De Guzman informed that body that there would be coming up new CMO's. Likewise, Dean Josefina Parentela reminded the body that it was agreed during the meeting that there will be no curriculum revision because there will be new curricula in 2018.

At this point, Prof. Flora Arellano moved that the revision of the Bachelor of Science in Interior Design curriculum be submitted to University Curriculum Evaluation Committee to review the revision and whatever output come up would be presented to the University Academic Council next meeting.

The motion, duly seconded, was approved.

- Bachelor of Science in Electronics and Communications Engineering

Chairperson Ana Liza R. Publico informed the body that the Bachelor of Science in Electronics and Communications Engineering is using 2011 curriculum. Under CHED Memorandum Order No. 24, series 2008, the Analytic Geometry has two (2) pre-requisite subjects, College Algebra and Trigonometry, but in current curriculum only Trigonometry appears as pre-requisite subject of Analytic Geometry.

VP Joseph Mercado said that there is no need for the revision on curriculum of BS in Electronics and Communication Engineering to pass through the approval of the UCCEC since there is no movement of subjects and it is only an additional of one (1) pre-requisite subject, which is College Algebra which is included in the current curriculum.

Likewise, Dr. Adela J. Ruiz added that there is no need to go the process since the subject existed in the curriculum.

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Dean Sanjay Claudio moved for the approval of the subject College Algebra along with Trigonometry as additional pre-requisite subject of Analytic Geometry.

The motion, duly seconded, was approved.

- Bachelor of Science in Electrical Engineering.

Chairperson Faustino R. Rural presented the revision made in 2011 Curriculum of Bachelor of Science in Electrical Engineering during the University Curriculum Evaluation Committee meeting. That the revisions are purely on the pre-requisites subjects in the 5th year level. There would be no additional number of hours and number of units, only the revision of pre-requisites and repositioning of subjects. Chair Rural added that there are many old students encountering problems during enrollment because of the pre-requisite subjects.

Dean Sanjay Claudio inquired about the policy with regards to the inclusion or removal of the pre-requisite subjects if there is really a need to pass through the University Curriculum Evaluation Committee. He added that some pre-requisites has no relation with other subject which can be done through the Office of the Vice President for Academic Affairs upon the recommendation of the College or experts in the program. Dean Claudio said that it took some time that this body will convene and for them to simplify some processes, he thought that previously VPAA just approved and furnish them a copy upon approval.

Dr. Adela Ruiz said that these are the existing guidelines and suggested to review the existing curricular guidelines in the VPAA office so that if these guidelines need to be revised, they should be presented in this body for appropriate revisions.

According to VPA Guilló, the effectivity of the revision will be no retroactive and decision should be made now based on the existing guidelines. He asked Dr. Ruiz, as former Director of the Curriculum Planning and Development Office on the case of Electrical Engineering.

Dr. Ruiz said that there is no need to present it tentatively because it is only minor revision of repositioning. But, in the case of removal, addition of subject, deletion in the number of units, increase in the number of units should be all presented and have the approval of the body even by the Board of Regents.



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On the query of VP Alberto Guillan as to when the effectivity of the revised BSEE curriculum, Chair Ruml answered that the change of pre-requisite subjects would take effect this 2nd semester, SY 2015-2016 since there were students who encountered problems in their enrolment, while the re-positioning of subjects will take effect next year.

President De Guzman stated that the implementation of the revised pre-requisites and re-positioning of subjects in the curricular of Bachelor of Science in Electrical Engineering and Bachelor of Science in Electronics and Communications Engineering will take effect immediately, this Second Semester, SY 2015-2016 to benefit the students.

V. OTHER ACADEMIC MATTERS

VP Milgrina A. Gomez informed the body that Mr. Antonio C. Mancupa Jr, President and Chief Executive Officer of East West Bank would be the mid-year commencement exercises speaker at PUP Gym on December 11, 2015.


There being no more matter to be discussed, Dean Sarjay Claudio moved for the adjournment of the meeting.

The motion, duly seconded, was approved.

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2. Details of the University Commencement Exercises, SY2014-2015

UR Zenaida R. Sarmiento reported that PUP will have a two-day graduation to be held on April 13, 2015 and April 15, 2015 at the PIOC Reception Hall and Plenary Hall. On April 13, 2015, there would be two clusters and three clusters for April 15, 2015.

3. Discussion on the Tagging of the Faculty Teaching Assignment

Chair Racidon P. Bernarte raised the issue of graduating students who were enrolled in NSTP-CWTS 2 but were not able to graduate because they came late to their class and the teacher did not accept them. Chair Bernarte explained that the students went to the Office of NSTP to verify their teacher and the NSTP Office advised them to wait for the tagging of the name of the teacher to the Student Information System (SIS). The students came to know their teacher through SIS only in February 2015 and they immediately went to their class. However, the teacher did not accept them because he had already provided the requirements to his class. Thus, as a Chairperson, Dr. Bernarte appealed to the teacher and to the Director of NSTP for consideration and compassion to the students.

Furthermore, Chair Bernarte suggested the early tagging of Faculty Teaching Assignment to the SIS and the assignment of a teacher who is compassionate enough to provide consideration to our students.

Director Rowelina B. Jacolbia informed the body that at the beginning of the semester, they already posted the NSTP schedules of classes and the teacher at the SIS and NSTP Office.

On the issue raised by Dr. Bernarte, Dir. Jacolbia explained that there was a previous teacher who handled class. However, when the said teacher gave it up, the class was assigned to Mr. Dan E. Dulac, an administrative employee from the Communication Management Office. Dir. Jacolbia also explained that an administrative employee should secure an authority to teach through a special order before his name can be tagged to the SIS.

For further information, Dir. Jacolbia read part of the letter of Mr. Dan E. Dulac dated March 23, 2015.

"Ms. Del Rosario and Mr. Dutilles are parts of the 57 persons of CWTS class, comprised of 52, 1st year, 3rd year and 4, 4th year students, whose NSTP classes started last December after I was informed by Ms. Eden Rendano of my teaching

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assignment for the 2nd semester. Ms. Del Rosario and Mr. Dantes received "withdraws" marks for their failure to attend their CWTS classes. They did not participate in the clean-up drive and campus beautification project launched by the BACR 1-1 CWTS class. They only showed up last week", that is already March.

Director Jacolbia said that the issue was appealed to the Office of the Executive Vice President. She added they would abide whatever the decision of the administration would be.

President De Guzman informed the Body that there was a similar case in the past but the decision was to respect the authority of the faculty. The administration could only intervene but cannot overrule or overwrite the decision of the faculty.

VP Salvador informed the body that he talked with NSTP Director and the teacher regarding the help they could extend to the students. The teacher said that he wanted to help the students but he has no basis. Mr. Dalac explained that the class records would be the bases of his decision. Thus, the decision was unfavorable to the students.

To avert occurrence of the same in the future, President De Guzman requested Director Jacolbia to make a request for the issuance to the administrative employees who will teach CWTS the authority to teach it before the semester starts.

Chair Dela Fuente informed the body that in previous practice, students from higher year levels were not allowed to enroll in regular NSTP section to avoid problem. There was one open section offered for all irregular students. He suggested adopting the previous practice and allotting one meeting place for faculty and students.

President De Guzman added that regular NSTP students should not be allowed enrolling in the open section.

On the inquiry of Dir. Jacolbia in case the open section which did not reach 35 students, Chair Dela Fuente suggested requesting statistic records of irregular students from ICT Office to be used as basis for offering Open Section for irregular students.

President De Guzman said that the students could be absorbed by other classes, provided that the irregular students were identified.



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4. Updates on the Preparation for K to 12 Program

President De Guzman informed the body that the law for K to 12 program has been signed by the President and the government has already spent a lot of money preparing for the implementation in 2016. President De Guzman added that a Committee was created to negotiate with the Department of Education (DepEd). The said Committee got a list of requirements from the Department of Education and started complying with the requirements. In one of the meetings conducted for the K to 12 program, the Committee decided accepting only 5,000 students for K-11 in 2016 because PUP is still preparing for its implementation. He further informed the Body that it was made clear that the subsidy would come from the DepEd which it would directly convey to the higher institutions. The proposal of the P25,000, the first figure intended for PUP but later on became P22,000, was not clear yet. They were asked by the Department of Education to think of a figure that the Department of Education would subsidize for grades 11 and 12 students who would enroll in PUP. The first reckoning that they considered was the per capita cost of a student in PUP which is P16,000, that is without computation, no SIS fee and others. DepEd also required PUP to make the distribution of fees. President De Guzman said that in a meeting with CHED, Congress, and some SUCs, they were informed to take a backseat in the preparation of the K to 12 because the priorities are the private higher education institutions.

Further, President De Guzman informed the body that PUP Laboratory High School would offer senior high school with the Expanded OAA as the source of fund.

5. President De Guzman announced the following:

- PUP ranked No. 10 in the Lists of Best Universities in the Philippines.
- The budget for NBC 461 Cycles 3 to 5 had been set aside already for approval of the PASUC Committee. The budget for Cycle 6 is already for approval.

6. VP Samuel M. Salvador informed the body that he would be bringing down his working tools as member of University Academic Council because he would be retiring in the first semester of this year. In 1978, he received a letter from Dr. Pablo T. Mateo Jr. informing him that he was duly recognized as member of the Academic Council and his first attendance in the University Academic Council was in 1979. For him, the University Academic Council is an exclusive club for qualified professors only. He thanked PUP under the stewardship of President De Guzman for the opportunity given to him.



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VII. ADJOURNMENT

There being no more matter to be discussed, Dean Sonjay P. Claudio moved for the adjournment of the meeting. With the motion duly seconded, the meeting was adjourned at 4:30 p.m.
