CONTRACT FOR GRANTS-IN-AID

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

This Contract for Grants-in-Aid titled "Lung Disease Identification and Classification through Neural Networks" entered into this October 2015, 2015 at Sta. Mesa, Philippines by and among:

The Polytechnic University of the Philippines, a higher education institution with principal office at Mabini Campus, Sta. Mesa, Metro Manila represented herein by its President, EMANUEL C. DE GUZMAN and herein referred to as the "GRANTOR".

and

The Project Team, represented herein represented by its team leader ORLAND D. TUBOLA, and herein referred to as the "IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM".

WITNESSETH, that:

WHEREAS, no. 2 agenda of 8-point agenda of the Polytechnic University of the Philippines towards an epistemic community aims at strengthening research, publications and creative works;

WHEREAS, pursuant to this agenda the Polytechnic University of the Philippines through the Office of the Vice President for Research, Extension, Planning and Development appropriated funds for institutional researches;

WHEREAS, on the 21st day of July 2015, the University Research Evaluation Committee (UREC), made the initial approval of the research proposal.

WHEREAS, on the 3rd day of August, 2015, PUP through its Executive Committee (EXECOM), the final and executory body, approved the funding of the aforementioned institutional research.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing and the stipulations herein set forth, the parties hereby agree on the following:

I. DURATION OF THE PROJECT

The IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM, the composition of which is indicated in attached research proposal hereof, shall conduct a study entitled "Lung Disease Identification and Classification through Neural Networks" which the Implementing Institution shall satisfactorily complete for a period of Twelve (12) months commencing on the date the contract has been signed.

Notwithstanding the project duration stated herein, any renewal or continuation of the project must be approved by PUP thru its President upon the recommendation of the Vice President for Research, Extension, Planning and Development.

In case, it becomes evident to the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM during the implementation of the study that an extension beyond the termination date set out is necessary to achieve the objectives of this study, the IMPLEMENTING INSTITUTION shall immediately inform in writing the GRANTOR (PUP) through its President. The President with recommendation from the Office of the Vice President for Research, Extension and Development (OVPREPD), shall immediately determine whether an

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extension is necessary under the conditions. Provided, however, that in the event that an extension shall be granted, no additional financial grant in excess of the approved project grant stated above shall be awarded to the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM due to the extension of time allowed.

RATIONALE AND OBJECTIVES OF THE STUDY

Main Objective:

To design and construct a tripartite extension services and community involvement program of the academe, LGUs and the industry for community welfare and development.

OBLIGATION OF THE GRANTOR


- The GRANTOR shall provide the Implementing Research Team a grant-in-aid in the amount of Three Hundred Thirty Four Thousand Pesos (P 334,000.00). The releases of which shall be based on the approved schedule of expected deliverables and fund releases indicated in the approved Work and Financial Plan (WFP) (Annex C and D)
- The GRANTOR shall grant the regular faculty members who are not designees of the Implementing Research Team a reduction of twelve (12) units from the 15 units regular teaching load without prejudice to extra load (Policy on University Research and Development Support, Funding, and Incentives, 42rd BOR Meeting, October 19, 2013
- To facilitate and provide avenue where the research results could effectively and adequately be disseminated; and
- To own and utilize the results of the study which is possible related to policy decisions or action of PUP subject to Intellectual Property Ownership.

The IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM hereby understands that the GRANTOR is not liable for any amount in excess of the approved grant. Thus, the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM shall shoulder any and all expenses in excess of the Grant for furtherance of the project.

OBLIGATION OF THE IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM m.

- Undertake the Project strictly in accordance with the approved Work and Financial Plan (WFP) and Terms of Reference (TOR), a copy of which is hereto attached and made integral part of this Agreement as Annexes "A" "B" "C" and "D" respectively;
- Ensure that the Project shall be fully completed to the satisfaction of the GRANTOR and in accordance with the approved WFP and TOR;
- Provide, at its own expense, the counterpart support to fulfill the requirement of 3. the project including but not limited to project staff, their salaries/fees/wages or such other remunerations, office space, research facilities/equipment and other support facilities and requirements during the conduct of the research project;
- Ensure the strict project implementation in accordance with the approved WFP and TOR;

- Submit a full final report in hard and soft/electronic files and surrender to PUP after the termination of the project all raw data, observations and findings;
- Submit a financial report to the satisfaction of the GRANTOR not later than 60 7. days from the termination of the Project;
- Return the total amount released once the project is not completed due to negligence of the Implementing Research Team.
- PROJECT COST, SCHEDULE OF FUND RELEASES, AND LIQUIDATION OF FUNDS
 - A total budget allocation in the amount Three Hundred Thirty Four Thousand Pesos (P 334,009.00) for the whole project will be given directly to the Implementing Research Team by the GRANTOR for the conduct of the study. The releases shall be based on the approved WFP, LIB, TOR and Schedule of Deliverables and Tranche Releases (Annex C) chargeable against the University Research Fund and subject to the accounting and auditing regulations, pertinent government policies and procedures.

The Implementing Research Team shall not be responsible for the delay of the project implementation if such delay is directly caused by the late releases of the funds.

The Project Leader, Assistant Leader and research team members are prohibited from accepting any research project, fellowship, scholarship or training grant or leave his station for any trip abroad for more than one (1) month during the course of the project without securing prior approval and authorization of the Vice President for Research,, Extension, Planning and Development. In such case, the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM should assign an Officer-in-Charge to lead the project (in the absence of the project leader). If the period of absence is more than three (3) months, a replacement should be made.

- The GRANTOR is in no way under obligation to grant pension or gratuity to research staff retiring or laid-off in the course of or after completion/termination of the project.
- The service of the Project Leader and research/project staff shall be discontinued upon termination of the project or the specific work for which they were hired.
- 4. Research staff authorized under project Line Item Budget who shall be employed with items chargeable against the University Research Fund grant shall be engaged in by the project leader on contract/appointment basis, submitting to the GRANTOR in each case, a copy of the hiring paper together with the job description and qualification requirements.







5. Subcontracting of any part of the research shall require prior written approval from the Vice President for Research, Extension, Planning and Development. However, in the event that such sub-contracting is allowed, the IMPLEMETING RESEARCH TEAM shall be liable or responsible for the outputs of the party subcontracted.

VIII. OPTION TO TERMINATE OF FAILURE TO COMPLETE THE PROJECT

If the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM is found by the OVPREPD unable, unwilling or otherwise impeded to perform its obligations and responsibilities under this Contract, the Implementing Institution hereby agrees and consents to the termination by the GRANTOR of this grant in prompt and orderly manner so as to minimize further expenditures on the part of the GRANTOR.

Should the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM opt to terminate the project or a portion of the work as stated in the approved WFP within the project period or any extension granted thereof, the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM agrees to reduce a portion of the Contract Price up to fifteen percent (15%) corresponding to the particular incomplete work due per the approved work schedule.

Failure by the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM to satisfactorily complete the study within the period stated herein or any extension granted shall mean forfeiture or discontinuance of the Grant. The fund spent for the project will be returned to the university subject to salary deduction among members of the Implementing Research Team. The remaining balance of the study shall revert automatically to University Research Fund.

IX. OWNERSHIP OF RESEARCH OUTPUTS

The IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM and GRANTOR hereby agree and understand that intellectual property rights, ownership and enjoyment thereof arising from this study shall be governed by existing and future policies of the GRANTOR on Intellectual Property Rights such as but not limited to the following:

- The RESEARCH outputs developed from the study shall be jointly owned by the GRANTOR and the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM. Any publication arising from the activities undertaken by virtue of and pursuant to this Contract shall clearly establish and identify the Parties as the source of the output.
- All reports arising from activities undertaken by virtue of and pursuant to this Contract shall be made in the name of the Parties. The names of the principal authors, researchers and/or Project Leaders shall be identified, recognized and included in the report.
- 3. The GRANTOR shall have the right to freely use all data and findings by virtue of and pursuant to this Contract for any of the purposes within its legal mandate. However, the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM shall in writing request permission from the GRANTOR on the intent to use any of the data or information contained in the report and the purposes thereof.
- 4. Copyright, royalties and other economic rights arising from work produced or developed from the Project shall be owned by the GRANTOR and the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM in accordance with the following proportion:

GRANTOR - 60% IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM - 40%









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It is the obligation of the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM to obtain or cause the assignment of the copyright and such other economic rights over the work under this Project in favor of the GRANTOR, copy furnished the GRANTOR, and said documents shall form part of the Terminal Report of the said IMPLEMENTING INSTITUTION and without which no acceptance of the said project output shall be issued by the GRANTOR.

X. ASSIGNMENT OF RIGHTS

The IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM shall not assign, sub-let or subcontract any portion of the project covered by this Contract except upon prior written approval of the GRANTOR. Any such assignment, sub-lease or sub-contracting shall be governed by Section VII, item no. 6. Violation of this condition shall be a ground for the immediate termination of this Contract by the Commission.

XI. AMENDMENTS

The parties to this Contract, may by mutual consent and for as long as the same is within the purview of law, accordingly reverse, modify, amend, and delete any word, phrase, sentence or article in this Contract.

XII. EFFECTIVITY

This Contract shall take effect upon the signing hereof by both parties and upon receipt of Notice to Proceed by the Implementing Institution and shall remain in force until the completion of the work required of the partner as indicated in the WFP. The parties hereto, may upon mutual consent, amend or modify this Contract by or through an Addendum or Supplementary Contract signed by all parties shall form an integral part hereof.

2.2 Externally-Funded Researches refer to the research projects proposed by colleges, branches and research institutes/ centers which are sponsored by external stakeholder/s and/or external

2.3 Research Proposal refers to scholarly projects that are aligned with the University Research Agenda (URA) and are feasible to be implemented within a maximum of one (1) calendar year.	
Section 3. Eligibility	
3.1 Any of the following can be considered as lead project proponent:

Section 5. Limitations

- 5.1 The number of project team members shall be subjected to the rules of the external funding agency.

- 5.4 The project leader shall be responsible for the research project fund. Hence, s/he shall serve as the Cash Disbursing Officer (CDO), subject to the existing accounting rules and regulations.
- 5.5 The lump sum of the approved research project budget must be deposited in the University account and shall be disbursed to the CDO.
- 5.6 The policies and guidelines of the external fund provider/s shall be consistent with those of the University in terms of honoraria and other funding support.

Mabini Campus, Anonas Street, Sta. Mesa Manila represented in this Agreement by its President, DR. EMANUEL C. DE GUZMAN, herein referred to as the Implementing Agency.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the above-mentioned research and development (R&D) project hereinafter referred to as the Novel Material as Anode and Cathode Electrode for Power Generator Al-Air Reactor has been thoroughly evaluated by DOST-PCIEERD and was duly approved by the PCIEERD Governing Council in its 93rd meeting on 08 April 2019 through GC Resolution No. 27, series of 2019;

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises, the PARTIES hereby agree to the following terms and conditions:





I. OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT

- To develop a novel material as anode electrode for Aluminum-air-based battery
- 2. To characterize the developed electrode physical and electrochemical property
- To design and fabricate a working prototype Al-air-based battery pack utilizing the developed anode electrode so as to evaluate its energy generation performance.
- To test the developed Al-air-based battery pack for actual utilization as battery for electric bicycle, smart phone charger and battery for DC lighting system

II. OPERATION OF THE PROJECT

The Project shall be undertaken by the UNIVERSITY in accordance with the approved project proposal (made part hereof as Annex "A") and the Revised DOST-GIA Guidelines (A.O. 009 S. of 2017).

III. FUNDING ASSISTANCE

The DOST-PCIEERD shall provide grant in the amount of Ten Million Three Hundred Twenty Nine Thousand Six Hundred Forty Six Pesos (Php 10,329,646.00) for two (2) years with an initial Year 1 grant of Seven Million Four Hundred Ninety Seven Thousand Three Hundred Twenty Three Pesos (Php 7,497,323.00) to be expended based on the scheduled release of funds and as allocated in the approved Project Line-Item Budget (made part hereof as Annex "B"). Guidelines on the Grants-in-Aid Program as may be determined by the DOST-PCIEERD shall govern the implementation of the Project.

The activities, operation of books of accounts and records of the projects shall be subject to reasonable inspection by authorized representatives of **DOST-PCIEERD**. The **DOST-PCIEERD** reserves the right to discontinue the projects or its assistance at any time for cause as determined by the **DOST-PCIEERD**, to include but not be limited to, violation of the Grant Agreements, fraud or falsity in the **UNIVERISTY**'s warranties and representation as provided by the proponent or upon determining that the results which were obtained or reasonably expected do not justify further activity.

All income/interest derived from the program/projects, if any, and all unexpended balance shall be reported immediately and remitted to DOST-PCTEERD by the UNIVERSITY after the termination of the program/projects.

IV. PROJECT DURATION

The Project shall be completed within a period of twenty four months with the Year 1 implementation covering the period 01 June 2019 to 31 May 2020. Parties shall agree on the starting date of implementation, which shall not be later than the date of receipt of funds by the UNIVERSITY.



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V. FUND RELEASE AND UTILIZATION

The financial grant shall be released by the DOST-PCIEERD to the UNIVERSITY, subject to applicable rules and regulations and availability of funds.

The UNIVERSITY shall abide by the applicable rules and regulations on disbursement and utilization as mandated by the DOST-PCIEERD and existing government accounting and auditing rules and regulations, to include in particular but not be limited to, rules on direct and indirect costs.

VI. PROJECT PROPERTIES

Project References: Mention of above-stated project in any and all publication, literature and information material in whatever media form shall state reference to the DOST-PCIEERD as project Funding/Monitoring Agency, and UNIVERSITY as the Implementing Agency. Failure on the part of any party to comply with this provision shall be ground for written documented protest; further, repeated non-compliance with this provision by one party shall allow the aggrieved party to inform affected third parties in writing and require proper attribution through publication, with cost charged against the offending party.

Intellectual Property (IP): Ownership and utilization of IPs and Intellectual Property Rights (IPRs) resulting from the project shall be governed by the Philippine Technology Transfer Act of 2009. The UNIVERSITY and the Project Leader acknowledge that they have read, understood and hereby agree to be bound by the provisions of the said Act. In case of conflict with other laws, rules or regulations, the said Act shall prevail.

Records of Equipment: The Property Officer/s of the DOST-PCIEERD and UNIVERSITY shall maintain a complete and updated record of all equipment purchased out of the grant funds. Inventory of equipment shall be conducted by the DOST-PCIEERD during the implementation of the project.

Ownership of Equipment: The DOST-PCIEERD shall initially own all equipment, including but not limited to the fabricated equipment, under its account until it may deem fit to transfer the same to other projects or implementing institutions, subject to existing government accounting and auditing rules. The UNIVERSITY shall be accountable for the equipment duly receipted until the physical transfer/donation or disposition of ownership, as determined by the DOST-PCIEERD.

Upon request, the ownership of equipment may be transferred subject to the approval from DOST-PCIEERD. The DOST-PCIEERD reserves the right to transfer ownership of such government equipment subject to existing government accounting and auditing laws, rules and regulations.

VII. ACCOMPLISHMENT AND FINANCIAL REPORTS

The UNIVERSITY shall submit to the DOST-PCIEERD all technical and financial reports as mandated by the DOST-PCIEERD, pursuant to applicable rules and regulations. The



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UNIVERSITY shall likewise acknowledge the assistance of the DOST-PCIEERD in relevant project-related activities.

VIII. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Amendment: This Agreement may only be amended in writing and by mutual consent of both parties.

Authority to Sign: Each person signing this agreement represents and warrants that he/she is duly authorized to sign this agreement. In the unlikely event that the person signing for the other party is not authorized to do so, the latter agrees to hold the other party/ies harmless for any cause or consequence of the absence/lack of authority to sign.

Arbitration: All disputes arising between and among the parties as to interpretation, operation or effect of any clause in the Agreement or any other difference between the parties shall first be resolved amicably. In case of failure, the Rules on Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) between national government agencies under Republic Act No. 9285 shall apply.

Indemnification: Each party shall indemnify, hold free and harmless, and defend at its own expense the other party/ies from and against all suits, claims, demands, and liabilities of any nature or kind, arising out of acts or omissions of the former, in the performance of any activity in connection with the program/project, including those that may be initiated by its employees, workers, agents, subcontractors, or by any other entity or persons against said party by reason of or in connection to the program/project.

Venue: The parties further agree that in case of legal action requiring court litigations that may arise in the enforcement of this Agreement, the venue of court litigation shall be in the Court of Competent Jurisdiction sitting in Taguig City only.

In such case, the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM should assign an Officer-in-Charge to lead the project (in the absence of the project leader). If the period of absence is more than three (3) months, a replacement should be made.

- The GRANTOR is in no way under obligation to grant pension or gratuity to research staff retiring or laid-off in the course of or after completion/termination of the project.
- The service of the Project Leader and research/project staff shall be discontinued upon termination of the project or the specific work for which they were hired.
- 4. Research staff authorized under project Line Item Budget who shall be employed with items chargeable against the University Research Fund grant shall be engaged in by the project leader on contract/appointment basis, submitting to the GRANTOR in each case, a copy of the hiring paper together with the job description and qualification requirements.
- Subcontracting of any part of the research shall require prior written approval from
 the Vice President for Research, Extension, Planning and Development. However,
 in the event that such sub-contracting is allowed, the IMPLEMENTING
 RESEARCH TEAM shall be liable or responsible for the outputs of the party
 subcontracted.

VI. OPTION TO TERMINATE OF FAILURE TO COMPLETE THE PROJECT

If the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM is found by the OVPREPD unable, unwilling or otherwise impeded to perform its obligations and responsibilities under this Contract, the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM hereby agrees and consents to the termination by the GRANTOR of this grant in prompt and orderly manner so as to minimize further expenditures on the part of the latter.

Should the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM opt to terminate the project or a portion of the work as stated in the approved WFP within the project period or any extension granted thereof, the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM agrees to reduce a portion of the Contract Price up to fifteen percent (15%) corresponding to the particular incomplete work due per the approved work schedule.

Failure by the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM to satisfactorily complete the study within the period stated herein or any extension granted shall mean forfeiture or discontinuance of the Grant. The fund spent for the project will be returned to the university subject to salary deduction among members of the Implementing Research Team. The remaining balance of the study shall revert automatically to University Research Fund.

VII. OWNERSHIP OF RESEARCH OUTPUTS

The IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM and GRANTOR hereby agree and understand that intellectual property rights, ownership and enjoyment thereof arising from this study shall be governed by existing and future policies of the GRANTOR on Intellectual Property Rights such as but not limited to the following:


- The RESEARCH outputs developed from the study shall be jointly owned by the GRANTOR and the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM. Any publication arising from the activities undertaken by virtue of and pursuant to this Contract shall clearly establish and identify the Parties as the source of the output.
- All reports arising from activities undertaken by virtue of and pursuant to this Contract shall be made in the name of the Parties. The names of the principal authors, researchers and/or Project Leaders shall be identified, recognized and included in the report.
 - The GRANTOR shall have the right to freely use all data and findings by virtue of and pursuant to this Contract for any of the purposes within its legal mandate. However, the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM shall in writing request permission from the GRANTOR on the intent to use any of the data or information contained in the report and the purposes thereof.
- 4. Copyright, royalties and other economic rights arising from work produced or developed from the Project shall be owned by the GRANTOR and the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM in accordance with the following proportion:

GRANTOR - 60% IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM - 40%

It is the obligation of the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM to obtain or cause the assignment of the copyright and such other economic rights over the work under this Project in favor of the GRANTOR, copy furnished the GRANTOR, and said documents shall form part of the Terminal Report of the said IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM and without which no acceptance of the said project output shall be issued by the GRANTOR.

IX. ASSIGNMENT OF RIGHTS

The IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM shall not assign, sub-let or sub-contract any portion of the project covered by this Contract except upon prior written approval of the GRANTOR.

X. AMENDMENTS

The parties to this Contract, may by mutual consent and for as long as the same is within the purview of law, accordingly reverse, modify, amend, and delete any word, phrase, sentence or article in this Contract.

XI. EFFECTIVITY

This Contract shall take effect upon the signing hereof by both parties and upon receipt of Notice to Proceed by the IMPLEMENTING RESEARCH TEAM and shall remain in force until the completion of the work required of the partner as indicated in the WFP. The parties hereto, may upon mutual consent, amend or modify this Contract by or through an Addendum or Supplementary Contract signed by all parties shall form an integral part hereof.
