Anonas Street, Sta. Mesa, Manila, represented herein by its Dean, ENGR. GUILLERMO O. BERNABE(hereinafter referred to as PUP);

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY PHILIPPINES FOUNDATION, INC a non-stock non-profit corporation organized and existing under Philippine laws, with office address at 5F, 111 Pasco de Roxas Condo Bldg, Tower 1, Pasco de Roxas corner Legaspi Street, Legaspi Village, Makati City, represented herein by its Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer MR. CHARLITO S. AYCO(hereinafter referred to as HABITAT).

#### WITHNESSETH, THAT:

WHEREAS, the Parties are represented in this Agreement by their duly-authorized representatives who are empowered with their respective Secretary's Certificates attached herewith as Annexes "A" and "B" which are made as integral parts hereof;

WHEREAS, poverty is a major problem in Philippine society today which is best exemplified by the proliferation of slum communities, shanties and makeshift dwellings nationwide, especially in cities and urban growth areas;

WHEREAS, HABITAT provides simple, decent and affordable shelter to persons who belong to the bottom thirty percent (30%) of the Philippines' income distribution by building or transforming communities so that its home partners will have better access to socio-economic opportunities and therefore, attain better quality of life;

WHEREAS, volunteerism is a vital force for social change and a way for which the youth can contribute to solve human, social and environmental problems particularly inadequacies of decent shelter for the underprivileged members of society;

WHEREAS, PUP-College of Engineering has been working in partnership with HABITAT through its EXTENSION programs. It now wishes to expand the scope of its partnership through the College of Engineering to include the faculty and students of the entire University in its endeavors to help HABITAT communities not only in building houses/but also in sharing its expertise in community building as well (the "Project");









WHEREAS, the Parties wish to establish a partnership so that the energy, talent and skills of PUP's faculty and students would be properly channeled by involving them in character building and development activities.

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises and terms and conditions set forth below, the Parties hereby enter into this agreement, to wit:

- Term. This Agreement shall be effective upon signing by both Parties and will remain valid and binding for a period of five (5) years, or from 2014 to 2019.
- The Project. PUP-College of Engineering agrees to participate in HABITAT's community and house building programs, such as but not limited to the following
  - a. Providing volunteers from among its faculty and students in building house
  - b. Sending interns for on-site and office works;
  - Providing training and support to home partners in areas such as but not limited to:
    - Livelihood programs
    - Technology transfer (silk screen printing, basic photography, 2. basic electrical wiring, basic welding, car washing, Aircon cleaning and repair, Auto-cad, masonry, carpentry, basic computer programing, computer trouble shooting, basic electronics, electronics repair and trouble shooting)

      Education and literacy programs (computer literacy and fluency)

    - Entrepreneurship skills training
    - Values Formation programs
    - Zero-waste management
  - d. Assist HABITAT in the following areas of study for the communities:
    - 1. Solar and renewable energy
    - 2. Green innovations towards sustainability
    - 3. Quick response and disaster preparedness
  - e. Encourage its student leaders and other members of the student body to actively participate in the activities of HABITAT's youth movement especially in Youth Builds and other fund raising and awareness-building events not only as participants but also as organizers and members of steering committees.











Obligations of HABITAT. HABITAT shall perform the following: a. Inform PUP about HABITAT'S projects and evaluate which programs could the PUP College of Engineering students and faculty members best contribute to hone their skills; Allow PUP-College of Engineering to actively participate in building homes and communities, subject to the supervision and control of c. Take charge of developing programs and provide technical support suitable for the student and faculty volunteers in building houses for the community. Both parties can pre-terminate this. MOA upon formal written notice Atleast thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of termination. 5. Mutual Agreements. Both Parties agree to the following: a. Provide mutual recognition of one another as partners in the advertisements and promotional materials for the Project, and invite key offices in special events and activities involving the Project; and

B. The Parties to this MOA agree to act in good faith and fidelity in
exercising their rights and obligations and to mutually lend to one
another maximum assistance and cooperation to the end that the purpose and object of this Agreement are achieved expeditiously and harmoniously. The Parties further agree to execute such other implementing agreements and instruments, and do such other acts as necessary to implement the intent of this Agreement.
