







### RATIONALE

For more than a century, the Polytechnic University of the Philippines has produced many of the country's manpower and workforc. Being the largest state university in the country, PUP promotes quality education to a greater mass of people through its quality and affordable academic programs.

PUP is also a civic oriented institution that offers expert services and extension programs to the needy and marginalized groups of the society. This willingness to serve the community and society is embodied and highlighted in the 8-point agenda of PUP President, Dr. Emanuel C. De Guzman on Institutionalizing Civil Society Engagement and Involved Extension Service Program.

Extension is one of the major thrusts of PUP. As such, PUP's continuing efforts in eradicating poverty is pivotal in its extension programs. This thrust is attuned to the attainment of the country's development goals. The University, with its numerous partnerships and projects with stakeholders, benefited countless recipients of its extension programs. Some of its initiatives are adopt-a-community and village renewal program; countryside development for the poor through promotion and organization of cooperatives; technical, business and livelihood assistance given to groups and/or marginal sector of the society.

A portfolio of relevant trainings ably handled by knowledgeable and competent university trainers/experts serves as the blueprint of extension work offered by this institution. G the mandate of the University's Research and Extension Management Office(REMO), the projects of the various units of the University are centralized and anchored on assisting and empowering communities and groups through the proper handling and transferring of technologies i.e. material or expertise.

The University extension project dubbed as Salin-Kaalaman, Tungo sa Kaunlaran project – is an integrated faculty expert transfer of technology designed to provide basic information and knowledge to identified community and other institutions needing expert services from the faculty trainers of the University. The project is recognized and endorsed by the Philippine Association of State Universities and Colleges (PASUC)

### TARGET BENEFICIARIES

The project is currently implemented in twenty three (23) Barangays in Sta. Mesa, Manila and will be replicated in selected extension campuses of the University. Project beneficiary includes the barangay officials, household parents, out-of-school youth, indigent children and special groups. Trainings to be given are divided on the following areas:

- Livelihood and skills training
- Basic literacy
- Health and wellness
- Environmental and
- Special training topic for special groups



### PROJECT MANAGEMENT

Presently, the Research and Extension Management Office (REMO) through the Center for Extension Management Services is in-charge of the project in coordination with the Community Relations and Extension for Development Office (CREDO). Faculty-experts coming from various colleges and departments render voluntary service in the implementation of the project.

### PROJECT PARTNERS AND COLLABORATORS

PUP are inviting multi-sectoral groups as its project collaborators which come from the government sector, NGO's and other private organizations. The University enters into a Memorandum of Agreement with its partners to delineate roles in the project

Currently, the University utilizes its fund to execute the project. However, external funding and cost-sharing arrangement are also made to sustain the project.


