#### DURING THE DRILL

 On July 30, 2015 continuously ring all the school Bell or Siren, use the public address (PA) system or do verbal instructions to signal the start of the SHAKE DRILL.

 Play audio recording of a rumbling earthquake sound (the one you downloaded) on your PA.

Advise everyone to perform the Drop, Cover and Hold position.

While down on the floor, students should look around for possible materials that might fall, break or collapse such as glass windows, ceiling fans and cabinets etc. and make conscious efforts to avoid them.

After 45 seconds, the ringing of the bell will stop to signal that the shaking has stopped.

6. Everyone may stand up and proceed to evacuate to the safer area based on the evacuation plan.

Use the BUDDY SYSTEM. Students should exit their classrooms in pairs with one teacher in front and another at the end of the line (or tshe class president). Take a look at other classrooms on the right and left and determine whether the group's assistance is needed.

#### **DURING THE DRILL**


- On July 30, 2015 continuously ring all the school Bell or Siren, use the public address (PA) system or do verbal instructions to signal the start of the SHAKE
- Play audio recording of a rumbling earthquake sound (the one you downloaded) on your PA. Charles Parties
- 3. Advise everyone to perform the Drop, Cover and Hold position.
  - While down on the floor, students should look around for possible materials that might fall, break or collapse such as glass windows, ceiling fans and cabinets etc. and make conscious efforts to avoid them.
- After 45 seconds, the ringing of the bell will stop to signal that the shaking has 5. stopped.
- 6 Everyone may stand up and proceed to evacuate to the safer area based on the evacuation plan.
- Use the BUDDY SYSTEM. Students should exit their classrooms in pairs with one teacher in front and another at the end of the line (or tshe class president). Take a look at other classrooms on the right and left and determine whether the group's assistance is needed.

#### PUP SHAKE DRILL

Activity

: MMDA Metro Wide Shake Drill

Purpose

: To increase the Metro's chances of better recovery and implementation of contingencies in the event of earthquakes.

Time Frame: Mobilization started after the July 2, 2015 coordination meeting with participating schools and establishments at the Holiday Inn Hotel, Makati City. Seminars and workshops were conducted to ensure that the participants will be well-informed about what to do during calamities and during the actual drill, July 30, 2015 at 10:30 AM.

#### NARRATIVE REPORT

A total of 20,000 students, faculty members and administrative personnel of the Polytechnic University of the Philippines System participated in the shakedrill. The members of the Evacuation Committee were waiting at their designated areas. Upon the signal of the Team Leader of the University Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (UDRRMC) the drill commenced at exactly 10:30AM.

A 45-second rumbling noise was played which was an indication of an earthquake Upon hearing the sound, the students performed the "Drop, Cover and Hold". After the sound ended, the sirens and the school bell were rang continuously which meant the start of evacuation. The students, faculty members and administrative staff were led to the PUP Oval, the assigned Evacuation Area.

Once at the Evacuation Area, the attendance was checked to make sure that everybody is accounted for. The classrooms, offices and grounds were checked for any casualties. The injured, wounded and incapacitated were brought to the Triage Area and were given immediate treatment by the Medical Team. An ambulance was on standby in case someone needed to be brought to the hospital.

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The Fire Management Committee was also on hand when an explosion, which was one of the practice scenarios, happened at the Food Technology Laboratory. The committee was armed with fire extinguishers to instantly put out the fire and prevent it from razing the Nutrition and Food Science Building.

The drill at the nearby PUP campuses likewise went very well. The students performed the "drop, cover and hold" while being directed to the assigned evacuation areas and the local UDRRMC committees were also in close coordination to make sure that everything goes as planned. The medical teams were on call at the triage areas ready to treat casualties.

The drill ended at around 11:20AM. After PUP President De Guzman declared that there were no damages to the buildings, the students were asked to go back to their respective classes and the employees to their offices. The 20,000 strong faculty, administrative staff and students who participated in the drill were all accounted for and were informed of what to do in the event of a disaster. The local UDRRMC committees from the different colleges and offices were quick to respond and really did their best to serve the PUP Community.

Even with a few minor slips, the PUP Shake Drill can be called a success because of the full participation of the entire PUP Community and because the goal of promoting awareness was realized. If and when a disaster hits the campus, the PUP Community will know what to do ensuring a disaster-free and protected society.

Suggested in-House Earthquake Drill for Colleges and Universities

Life Safety: Drop, Cover and Hold Drill and Building Evacuation

#### Before the Drill

- To participate in the earthquake drill, there is a need to register your school in the website cited above as an official participant with details on the number of participants and the focal person(s) to lead the drill.
- 2. The announcement of the drill may emanate from the Commission on Higher Education (CHED). Authorities may also remind the students and faculty of the scheduled drill via the school website and other social media account or thru bulletin boards inside school premises which includes the following details:
  - Date and time of the Shake Drill;
  - Role of teachers, students, non-teaching personnel, parents and security people on the drill;
  - How to correctly perform Drop, Cover and Hold position wherever they
    are. This can be done by taking cover beneath a sturdy table or seat and
    covering your head with your hands and arms.
- 3. Parents of students may also be invited to join the drill.
- 4. As for the actual drill, student officers of the Reserve Officers Training Corps (ROTC), Literacy Training Service (LTS) and Civic Welfare Training Service (CWTS) may be tapped for first aid response, manning of command posts, inventory of danger objects that might fall on an actual earthquake, survey of potential evacuation areas and ushering of lower year schoolmates towards the identified evacuation sites.
- 5. (Optional) Download from <a href="www.metromanilashakedrill.com">www.metromanilashakedrill.com</a> a realistic earthquake sound effects ready to be played during the shake drill.
- Assign or delegate Public Safety Officer(s) who will serve as lead or focal
  persons for this activity. Teachers and/ or school personnel may be
  assigned to these tasks. It is advised that such officers are familiar with





the surroundings. As for the marshalling, it is mandatory that the teacher(s) inside the classroom during the occurrence of an earthquake will serve as the guide of the students on when or where to evacuate. The possibility of experiencing an earthquake while in school will be high since colleges and universities operate from almost everyday starting at 6:00 am. Until 9.00 p.m.

- 7. Professors, employees, parents, select students, security and alumni (if possible) should develop an earthquake evacuation and response plan including maps and signages posted clearly within school premises showing the evacuation routes and assembly areas. Take note that our theme is to Prepare, Survive and Recover.
- 8. To empower the studentry and to prepare them to the life beyond college, student from specialty courses may assist in the preparation of the evacuation and response plan. Engineering and architecture students for the route plan, criminology students for fire prevention and security, pre-med students for first aid, accounting and business students for the inventory of resources and people to mention a few courses relevant to the entire process.
- 9. Have an assessment of what things might fall in the classroom or in the gym i.e. glass walls, glass windows, cabinets, ceiling fan, basketball ring, bricks, etc. and make pre-cautionary measures to make them sturdier. It will be wise to inform the drill participants to veer away from possible objects that might fall as mentioned above.

#### Things to consider:

- 1. Determine the objectives of the drill. What would you like to test?
- 2. How will you direct the parents, teachers and students during and after the shaking? Consider that certain factors such as location, construction material type, age of structure will influence your decisions regarding what to do after an earthquake.
- 3. Prepare ahead. Secure legal documents of the school and that of the students in heavy duty cases, possibly waterproof for easy retrieval in a rubble. Computers and mainframes containing critical database and





student records needs to be secured. Cloud back up for these files is an option for the school. Strengthen weal structures.

4. Identify the possible scenarios: power outages, closed roads and down telecommunications. Many parents, under these circumstances will unable to pick up their children. Going back to their respective homes on their own will also be a challenge.

#### During the Drill

- Gather the team assemble (safety officers, professors, parents, other employees, select students, alumni) in a room a few minutes before the drill and share the drill objectives.
- At exactly 10:30 a.m. on July 30, 2015 continuously ring all the school bell or buzzer, use the public address (PA) system or do verbal instructions to signal the start of the Shake Drill.
- 3. Play audio recording of a rumbling earthquake sound (the one you downloaded) on your PA.
- 4. Advise everyone to perform the Drop, Cover and Hold position.
- While down on the floor, students should look around for possible materials that might fall, break or collapse such as glass windows, ceiling fans and cabinets etc. and make conscious efforts to avoid them.
- After 45 seconds, the ringing of the bell will stop to signal that the shaking has stopped.
- Everyone may stand up and proceed to evacuate to the safer area based on the evacuation plan.
- 8. Use the BUDDY SYSTEM. Students should exit their classrooms in pairs with one teacher in front and another at the end of the line (or the class president). Take a look at other classrooms on the right and left and determine whether the group's assistance is needed.
- 9. Use the alternate routes in your evacuation map if there is any obstruction or your pathway is unsafe or deemed dangerous to use.

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Students should cover their heads with their bags and books. Do not use the elevators.  $\begin{tabular}{ll} \end{tabular}$ 

- 10.If an aftershock occurs while exiting, once again Drop, Cover and Hold until the shaking stops and is now safe to proceed to a safer ground such as parking space and open field away from trees or electric posts.
- 11.It is advisable to stay together and evacuate safely and quietly using the 4 universally accepted Evacuation Rules: Don't Talk! Don't Push! Don't Run! And Don't Turn Back!
- 12. Professors are to remain in their CLASS at all times and students from the same class must remain together during the duration of the drill. Periodic roll call by the professor is needed. Keep the students quiet for them to hear what is being announced at the PA system.
- 13.Safety Officer / Point person to conduct a headcount and ensure that nobody is left in the classrooms and everyone is accounted for. Extra effort in assistance should be given to elderly faculty and PWD students as they are the most vulnerable during an earthquake.

#### Things to consider:

 Make the Shake Drill a fun experience. The aim is to instill the outputs of the drill to the daily lives of the students applying the knowledge learned from the drill wherever they may be. i.e., school, home, or any indoor structure

#### After the Drill

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- 1. Gather the team and discuss what worked well and what problems arose.
- 2. The Safety Officer should immediately conduct a post-drill assessment.
- 3. Discuss the lessons learned in the exercise.

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4. Evaluate the conduct of the drill by looking into the details of the exercise and by identifying possible areas for improvement. This may be doneusing a post-assessment form.
